



The Crowe Valley Conservation Authority has CANCELLED the **FLOOD WATCH** issued on the 6<sup>th</sup> of May 2018 effective immediately, 9<sup>th</sup> of May 2018 and issued a WATERSHED CONDITIONS STATEMENT – WATER SAFETY.

## **Watershed Conditions Statement – Water Safety**

Levels and flows have decreased significantly from the recent highs. Current levels and flows will continue to decrease or stabilize at or near seasonal norms for this time of year. Forecasted weather does not include significant amounts of precipitation for the watershed.

ALTHOUGH LEVELS AND FLOWS ARE RECEDING, THE CVCA CONTINUES TO URGE EVERYONE, ESPECIALLY CHILDREN TO STAY AWAY FROM ALL DAMS, WEIRS, HYDRO GENERATING PLANTS, BRIDGES AND ALL WATERCOURSES. CURRENT FLOWS IN RIVERS AND LARGER STREAMS OR CREEKS CAN STILL EASILY SWEEP PEOPLE INTO A DANGEROUS SITUATION CAUSING HARM OR DROWNING ACCIDENTS. HYPOTHERMIA IS STILL A POSSIBILITY AS WATER TEMPERATURES CONTINUE TO REMAIN COLD.

**This Watershed Conditions Statement – Water Safety will expire in seven (7) days, ending on 16<sup>th</sup> of May 2018.**
